2025 – Space 2 Be Me

When six members of the Amaro team dedicated a full week to volunteering at Space 2 Be Me, they demonstrated what authentic social value looks like in practice. The local charity, based near Amaro's Maidstone HQ, provides essential support to disabled children, young people, and their families, creating opportunities for quality time together whilst connecting families facing similar challenges.

Armed with paintbrushes, tools, and determination, the volunteers tackled much-needed maintenance and improvement work throughout the facility. Their efforts included sanding and painting skirting boards and doors, installing artwork, reorganising furniture and storage solutions, and ensuring every room was thoroughly cleaned and tidied. The comprehensive nature of their work, documented in detailed shift reports, shows the professional approach they brought to supporting this vital community resource.

What makes this initiative particularly meaningful is its authentic motivation. There was no business connection driving the decision, simply six individuals who recognised an opportunity to use their skills where they were genuinely needed. For Space 2 Be Me, having essential maintenance work completed by skilled volunteers means their limited resources can focus entirely on direct family support services.

The impact extends beyond the immediate improvements to the facility. Every freshly painted room and organised space contributes to an environment where vulnerable families can find respite and connection. For the Amaro team members involved, the experience reinforced the direct link between their professional capabilities and meaningful community impact, showing how workplace skills can translate into genuine social value when applied thoughtfully within the local community.

This week of volunteering exemplifies how businesses can create lasting positive change by investing their human resources, not just financial ones, in supporting local causes. The families who depend on Space 2 Be Me's services will benefit from these improvements for years to come, whilst the volunteers have strengthened their connection to the community that has helped shape who they are as a company.



2025 – School decking

2025 – West Highland Way
